GarageBand

Use GarageBand to add your voice or comments to mix soundtracks. This is helpful for video editing, but also for commenting on another audio file. This latter technique can be used to repeat the words from an audio file and then play it back so you hear the original and then your recording afterwards. Here's how:

- Open GarageBand, click New Project and select template Voice.
- In Save As, type in the title of your project, Where: Desktop, then click Create on the bottom right corner.



 Go to the GarageBand menu bar → Track → New basic track, repeat steps to add another track. You can also use the template's default tracks.

To Add Tracks from Online class

- 3. To Pause and Stop recording, click the record icon again.

To split recordings

- 1. Click and drag the red line to the part where you want to split the recording.
- 2. Go to the menu bar > Edit > Split

To Cut Part of Recording

1. Double click on recording or click on the Scissors icon on the bottom right.



2. Highlight the part of the recording you wish to delete and go to $Edit \rightarrow Delete$
